Graduation Credits Requirements

Requirements for graduation from a Maryland Public High School are listed below. Students must earn a minimum of 26 credits in Grades 9 through 12 to receive a Maryland High School Diploma from Harford County Public Schools.

First time 9th grade student in 2020-2021 school year and prior ▾

Student Service Requirement

There is a service learning component in the requirements for earning a Maryland High School Diploma. Student service learning activities are integrated into the existing HCPS curriculum for all subject areas in Grades 6-12. Students enrolled in Harford County Public Schools for three years beyond Grade 5 have met the state requirement for service learning.

The goals of the student service learning program are to promote a commitment to lifelong service, to develop responsible citizens, and to heighten the awareness of the needs of others and the global society in general. By infusing service education in the curriculum, students will acquire the knowledge and skills to appropriately serve others beyond their schooling years. Community service clubs and organizations are in full operation in each middle and high school to provide students with a wider range of service learning experiences.

SEO Admission Requirements

1. Current juniors or seniors
2. Meet CCR standards
3. 90% attendance
4. Students may enroll in **five** courses per academic year at no cost as HCPS will pay tuition and textbook fees.

Students who earn a failing final grade, or withdraw from a course beyond the penalty free withdraw date, will be accountable for the associated tuition and fees of the respective course(s).

Additionally, students who are unsuccessful in earning credit in the dual enrollment program are ineligible for tuition payment for two consecutive college terms.

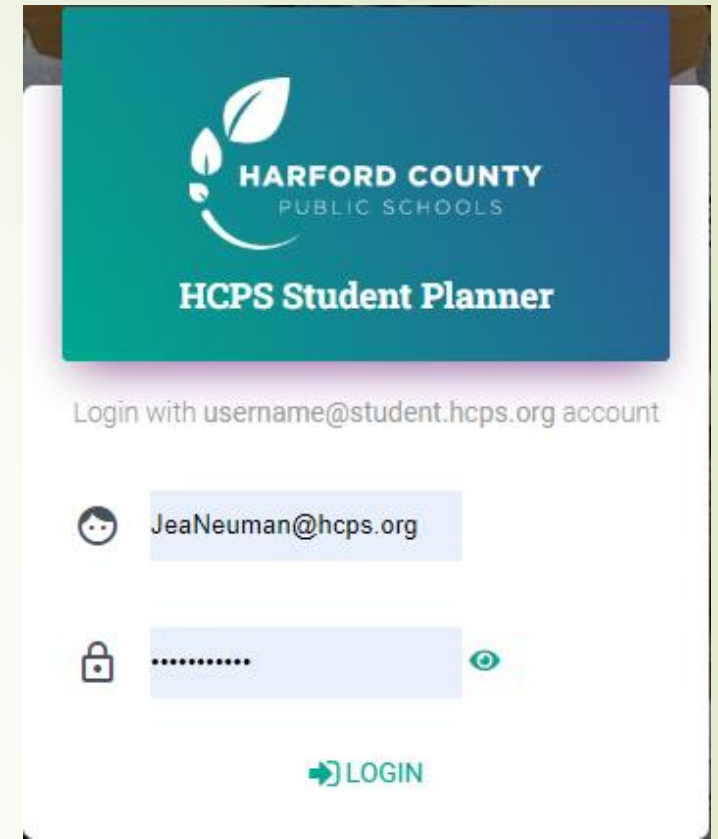
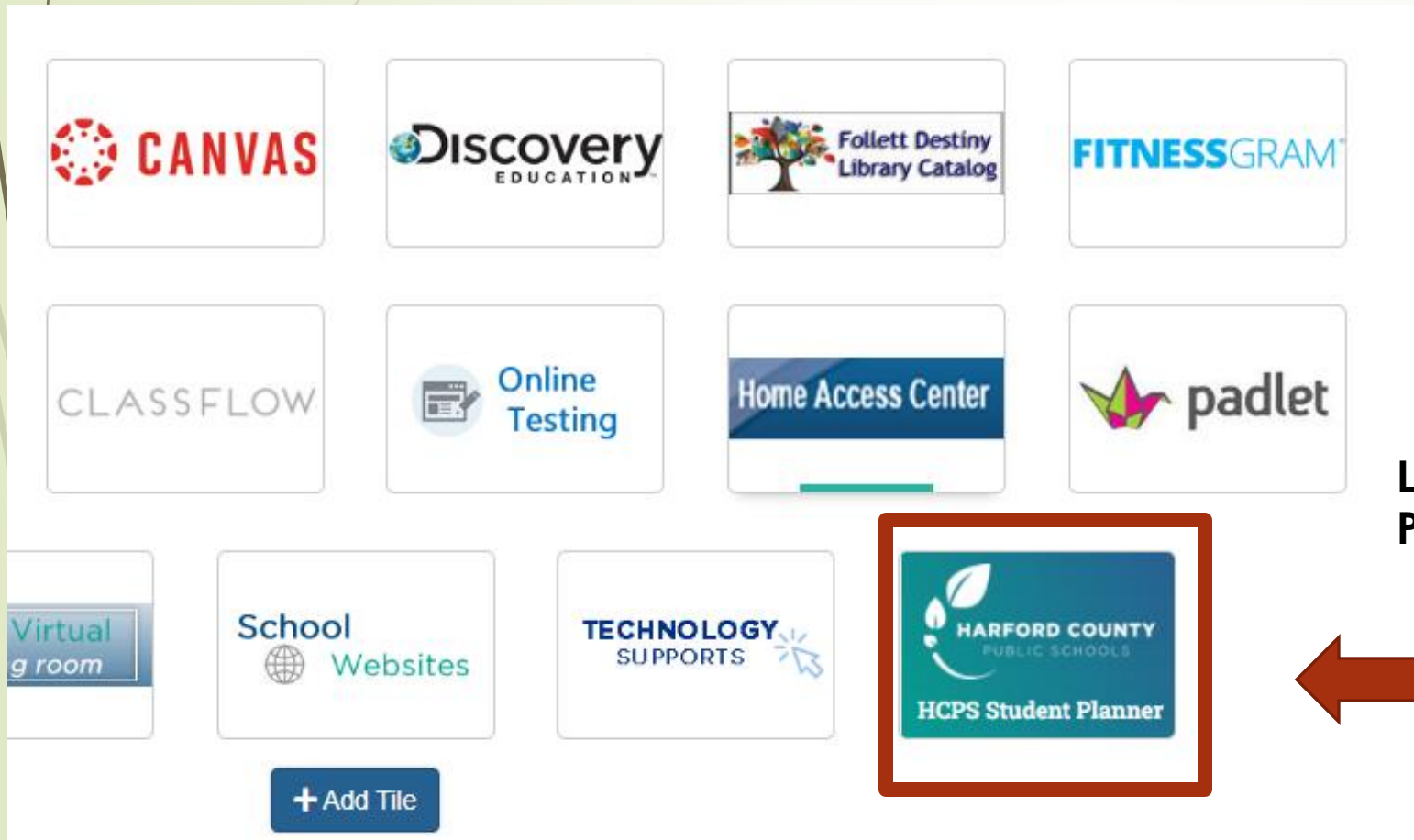

1. Complete an application
2. Complete a resume and cover letter
3. Obtain a teacher recommendation
4. Work with **Ms. Allred** to find and apply for the job/apprenticeship position you want
5. Or get your current employer on board as an apprentice business partner

Benefits

- Students enter the workforce while in high school and earn a salary.
- Earn high school credit for completing the program.
- Youth Apprenticeship is an HCPS Career & Technology Education Completer Program.
- Gain marketable industry skills and certifications.
- *Career Discovery* - Students have the opportunity to explore whether a specific industry aligns with their interests, which could save time and money.
- *Advancement Advantage* - Youth apprentices gain an advantage over other candidates as they acquire valuable career skills and build a professional network.
- *Confidence* - Students gain self-assurance by working independently under the tutelage of a mentor.
- Upon program completion, students receive a Maryland State Skill Certificate.

General Requirements

- Applicants must be rising juniors, juniors or seniors, age 16 years or older.
- Have reliable transportation.
- A student must complete the program by graduation.
- One year of related instruction is required.
- Applicants must be in good attendance and academic standing and on track to graduate.
- Students must complete 450 hours of work-based training.
